Advent is the 24 days leading up to Christmas when we pray and prepare for the feast of Christmas and the birth of Jesus.

For Christians it is the start of the Church's year.

The candles in the wreath can represent many things but the most popular is

- 1. Purple- Patriarchs (Abraham etc)
- 2. Purple- Prophets (Isaiah etc)
- 3.Rose/Pink John the Baptist
- 4. Purple the Virgin Mary
- 5. White Jesus

WHY PURPLE?

The church uses the colour purple to symbolise penitance, preparation and remembering. Although not as penitential as Lent, Advent is a time to reflect upon pur spiritual journeys and think about our spiritual growth. It is also a time to prepare for the coming of esus, and a time of joy which makes Advent a much ighter season than Lent

Some churches will go rose (pink) on the 3rd Sunday of Advent. This is a refreshment day when people can relax their fast a bit as a reminder that the penitential season is almost over.
